*Why Arena? ..*



**ARENA** theatre, now hitting the peak of its revival has become more and more successful the world over. Audiences seem to enjoy its intimacy. No longer need we buy the most expensive seat in the house to be able to enjoy more than a puppet like view of the action. Every seat provides an intimate view of the play.

**ARENA**, the original style of acting, goes back as far as the Greeks in their amphitheatres, and the Romans in their colosseums. In Shakespeare's day, the Elizabethan stage had the audience sitting on three sides of the actors. Regular proscenium stages, or the conventional theatre as we know it today, with the platform on one end of a hall, came with the artificiality of the Restoration era, and along with it came an artificial style of acting, whereby the actors would face front and shout lines to each other.

**THEATRE**, like everything else in our last century, has grown more and more realistic not only in its subject matter, but in its presentation. In consequences, we are experiencing, in our day, the inevitable change in the outward form as well.

**TODAY**, with all of our television and movies, people have become used to the intimacy of seeing people "up close." Having adjusted to the 3-Dimensional Cineramic, stereophonic screen, we are more aware, and ready for this same change in our theatres. Now that we can see and hear without effort, living theatre has become an experience as exciting as films but with twice as much pulse.

**THE GATEWAY THEATRE**, established in 1949, first used the arena style as an efficiency measure to save on building scenery. But the discovery of its values throughout the years caused the management, when face lifting time arrived, to invest not in the conventional proscenium, but in comfortable raised seating levels in-the-round, with a look toward the future.

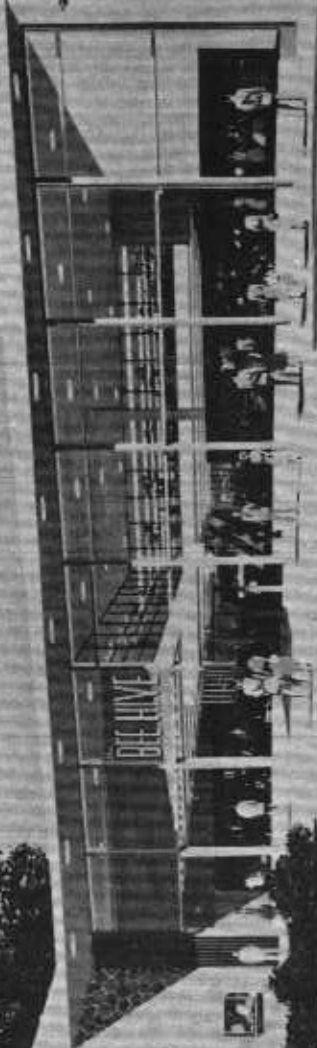

The Gateway Theatre was organized eight years ago by a stage-struck group of college students who wanted to join the "little theatre" movement to help decentralize theatre.

Throughout the years, professional actors joined the group, and Gateway developed a national reputation as being one of the few summer theatres producing good plays, reviving classics, and trying out the works of new playwrights.

Now in its eighth season, Gateway is a regular professional summer theatre employing actors who are members of Equity. Gateway runs an apprentice school where students have daily classes in drama and dance in the Theatre Workshop.

More and more people from the community have taken an interest in the born productions, not only in an acting capacity, but as sponsors, patrons, season ticket holders, backstage workers, contributors to the prop and costume rooms. We welcome this interest because we feel that theatre necessarily involves and specifically is a community venture.

**About the Author:-** Frederick Knott is an Englishman and was born in Kiukieng, China. Educated in England, he shone at tennis, at which he captained Cambridge University. In 1937 he visited the United States for the first time as a member of the Oxford-Cambridge tennis team which played against Harvard-Yale at Newport, R. I. There Knott observed some of the social satisfactions enjoyed by top tennis players, and this helped him create the character of Tony Wendice in "Dial M for Murder."

At the outbreak of World War II, Knott entered the British Army and served for six years, ending up as a Major in the Artillery.

After the war he decided upon a career as a dramatic writer, and served a year as a trainee with the J. Arthur Rank film organization in London. Though he was beginning to earn a moderate living by writing film treatments, he decided that if he was ever to get anywhere, he would have to write a novel or play of his own.

This was the impetus for writing "Dial M for Murder."

**About the Play:-** The fact that "Dial M for Murder," is called a mystery drama shows the persistence with which old descriptives, long outgrown, are continued on the stage, and take on new meanings. For this is a play about murder in which there is no mystery at all - at least for the audience - only suspense and anxiety. Such a play cannot be ticketed merely as a "suspense play" because every play comprises suspense, or should.

The calling of a modern-type murder play by the old-fashioned term "mystery drama" brings to mind the fact that another term for this kind of entertainment has also lost its original meaning. That is the term "melodrama," a combination of melody and drama stemming from the days when transparent plots and cheap dialogue were put over by the persuasive help of implausible music play from offstage.

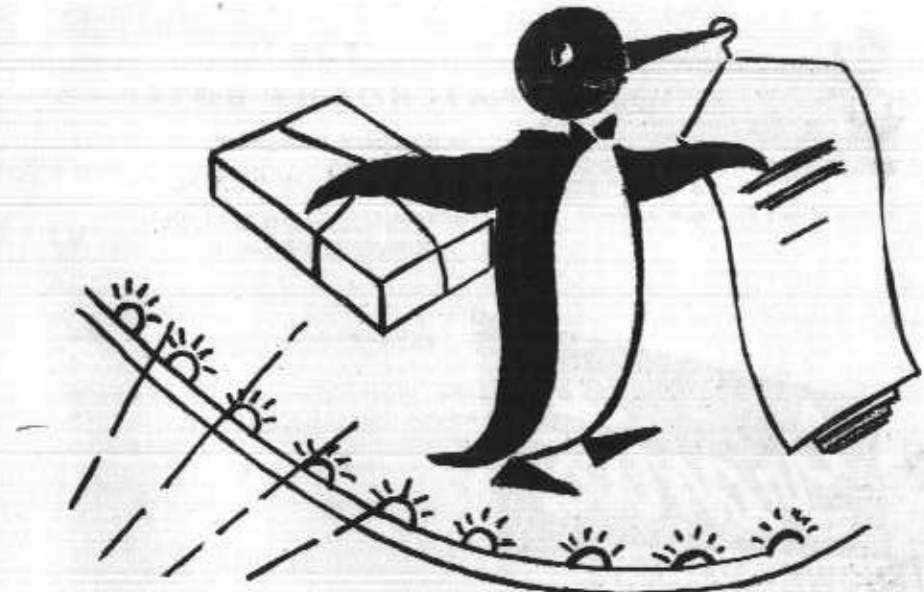
