



WHO'S WHO







For six successive years, Mr. Monsell figures prominently in the offerings of the Music Fair tent circuit. His Broadway plays include "His and Hers", "I Am a Camera" and the musical version of "Street Scene". Over twenty shows for "Kraft" and two years on the "Sargeant Bilko" series with Phil Silvers, give an indication of his considerable television credits.

DON DRAPER (Kilroy) won notice from critics for his role in the Broadway production of "Advise and Consent". Patrons of the Phonenix will remember among his performances, "Madam Wilf You Walk", and "Coriolanus". Mr. Draper has been top cast in nationwide tours of "Sabrina Fair", "Tender Trap", "The Best Man", "The Subject Was Roses" and "The Odd Couple". Summer and regional theatres including New Haven's prestigious Long Wharf Theatre have made use of Don Draper's talents in over 200 productions. He has essayed roles in musicals, (Plain and Fancy, Paint Your Wagon, Bells are Ringing, Pal Joey, How to Succeed..., etc.) as well as Shakespeare (Taming of the Shrew, Twelfth Night and As You Like It). Cinema audiences saw Mr. Draper in "No Way to Treat a Lady" and will soon see him in "The Night They Raided Minsky!s" and "Hello Dolly".

LUKE ANDREAS (Krojack) created his current role in the original Broadway cast. He won acclaim for his portrayal in NBC's color special "No Intermission" directed by Martin Hoad. Frequenters of "The Bitter End", "Hilly's and "La Bohemme" have enjoyed Mr. Andrea's regular comic, improvisational appearances. He received notices for his brilliant portrayal in Robert Lowell's "The Old Glory" directed by Johnathan Miller for the renowned American Place Theatre. That same theatre asked him to appear with Brock Peters in their production of "Outside Man" and again in "Juana Laloca" with Marian Seldes.

JOE ENDES (Sultan of Bashir) Actor, author, and director, Mr. Endes professional career encompasses comedy, drama, the classics, opera, musical comedy, reviews, childrens' theatre, clubs as well as TV. In three years with the Milwaukee Repertory Theatre, he performed in and assisted the director in productions ranging from "A Thurber Carnival" to "Under Milkwood". For summer theatres here and on the coast he has been seen in "The Fantasticks", "Bye Bye Birdie", "Music Man" and "Once Upon a Mattress" to name just a few. The versatile Joe Endes also teaches voice and diction and is the author of five musicals for children.

J. FRANK LUCAS (Chef and Kasnar) has toured the summer circuit with such stars as Groucho Marx, Dorothy Malone, Tony Randall and Ann Southern. He appeared in the Abe Burrow's version of "Breakfast at Tiffany's" with Richard Chamberlain and Mary Tyler Moore, and spent the summer and fall of 1967 at the Houston Music Theatre is a series of musicals with such stars as John Raitt, Andy Devine, Gizelle MacKenzie, Van Johnson, Patrice Munsel, Gardner MacKay and Hal March. In the world premiere of "Inherit The Wind" at Margo Jones' Theatre 55 in Dallas, he played the leading role which was later enacted on Broadway by the late Paul Muni and Melvyn Douglas. He has appeared on TV in "Time for Elizabeth" with Groucho Marx, on the Bob Hope "Chrysler Theatre" and is currently to be seen in the 20th Century Fox film "Curse of the Living Corpse.
