From The Barn to Broadway or Visa Versaand Then Back Again

Landing a Broadway show, a big dream for most performers, does not mean that they will then stay on Broadway for the remainder of their career. The acting world is not structured as a linear road to the top like the corporate world. Bernadette Peters, one of Broadway's greatest stars, only performed in five shows over a twenty year period! Most actors will continue to work in regional theaters like Gateway Playhouse and go out on tours, before and after a Broadway gig, making the structure more like a revolving door. Case in point is Lisa Brescia, who performed the role of Amneris on Broadway in Aida and then came here to grace us with her rendition of Eva Peron in 2005. Currently she is swinging/performing the role of Elphaba in Wicked back on Broadway.

The chance to work is what is important, and often a regional production or tour can offer

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a more challenging opportunity than was offered by a Broadway show. With budgets soaring into the tens of millions of dollars, Broadway has become a bigger business than ever, and it can be hard for an actor to get an audition for a role if the director can't envision him in it, or for political reasons, or more often than not, because the producers want a star for financial reasons. An actor talented enough for a leading role will land a small part or a spot in the chorus of a Broadway production because he or she is not a "name" - but they will be cast as the lead in a regional's production. Even when an actor does aet cast in a big role on Broadway, the show will eventually close, and the actor will be out auditioning again. Then there is the fact that regionals revive more shows every season than Broadway ever could, affording actors the opportunity to play roles that haven't been offered on Broadway in decades. For example, Gentlemen Prefer Blondes, opening at Gateway August 1st, debuted on Broadway in 1949 and was revived there in 1995, making all of the Lorelei Lee hopefuls at Gateway's auditions too young to have auditioned for either. Opportunities also often conflict, and a role can open up when an actor is otherwise committed, for example, being in rehearsal when auditions for another show are

being held. Actors experience this often, and tell

themselves that it was not meant to be.

Mead observed; "Jennifer Zimmerman performed on Broadway in "Les Misérables" and on national tours of "The Scarlet Pimpernel" and "Evita." At Gateway, she landed the plum role, Grizabella,'People think regional theater gets the leftovers, the second-rate performers, but it's not true," Ms. Zimmerman said. "Broadway has become so commercial, which means experienced, talented professionals have to step aside when a movie star takes the lead. So we reach out to regional theater."

The bonus for Gateway patrons then is that they can see Broadway talent right in Suffolk County at a fraction of the cost of going into the City. Currently on stage in Dreamairls are Jenelle Lynn Randall, Erich McMillan-McCall, Jesse Means, Tyrick Wiltez Jones, Trisha Jeffrey, Regge Allan Bruce and Kingsley Leggs - all of whom have Broadway credits in a wide variety of roles and productions that include The Color Purple, Hairspray, All Shook Up, Show Boat, and more. And it isn't just actors - Gateway also hires stage managers, directors, choreographers, musicians, set designers, and technicians with Broadway and national tour experience,

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

including Dreamgirls director/choreographer John Dietrich.

Still, while the experience of being on Broadway is magical, in the end, actors agree performing is what keeps them in what many consider to be an unpredictable and insecure business. Talk to someone in the theatre, though, and you'll find it is just this unpredictability that keeps them fresh. It's the challenge of new shows, new roles, and new experiences that allows Gateway to bring the best talent to its patrons, season after season.☆



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THE GATEWAY WINDMILL

One of the most recognizable features of the Gateway property is the wisteria-covered wooden windmill that stands next to the office building. The exact origins of the structure are lost to time; it was probably built between 1868 when the house that is now the office was built, and 1884 when the Mott family acquired the former Osborne estate. The brick building attached to it was built first and the windmill went up around it.



Gateway's founder, Harry Pomeran, along with his wife Libby and their children, Sally, David and Ruth, bought the property in the early 1940's and began operating it as a hotel. "We never called it a windmill, it was always 'the pump house', because under the stairs there is a huge artesian well," executive producer Ruth Allan remembers, "It pumped all the property's water and it was known as the best water in Bellport."

The family made the hotel as self-sufficient as possible, raising chickens, and growing fruit and vegetables. The Pump House became something of a fruit cellar, where Libby stored all her canned goods. "During the 1940's we had 200 chickens, and because we didn't have hotel guests in the winter, Mom preserved the eggs in brine. She also made jelly, and pickled pears from the pear tree. For us, the pump house was also my Dad's toolshed," said Ruth. The local wildlife found uses for the building as well - a family of white owls took up residence in the top of the tower.

On September 15, 1944, the Great Atlantic Hurricane made land for a second time on the East Coast, slamming into Long Island with 85 mph winds. The windmill's wheel fins were the only casualties of the storm on the Gateway property. "They were found as far away as Head of the Neck Road," said Ruth, "That night we stayed up praying and not one of those fins came down on anyone's

house." Harry Pomeran had installed an electric pump by then, so the fins were not replaced. Harry also reinforced the interior corners of the tower with steel. The building became a landmark, being the tallest structure around, it could be seen coming in from Bellport Bay. "It would be easy just to take it down, but it would be very hard not to have it. That, the barn, and the old wing of the house, that's Gateway. It's important to preserve it because of its antiquity," declared Ruth.

Over the years, age and weather took their toll on the windmill. The top of the structure had been steadily leaning at the rate of 2-3 degrees a year, but by this past autumn, the pitch had worsened to where the Allan family began to worry that a bad nor'easter would blow it off. The Bellport Fire Dept was called in to lend the services of their snorkel truck to temporarily shore up the building. Two weeks later a crane was hired to remove the top, and the family decided to begin restoration.

Architects Keith DeLucia from J&B Designs and Jack Rosebery from Rosebery Architectural Studio, Medford firms specializing in historic buildings, have created a design that will bring the windmill back to its 1940 look including the roof, picket fence around the top, wheel and fins. Paul plans for the restored windmill to be functional, "It should generate enough electricity to power itself, its lighting, etc," he said. Gateway Playhouse will offset the restoration costs with a special event, "The Summer Wind" a concert that will feature songs and singers from Gateway's best-loved productions.

What everyone associates most with the windmill is the wisteria that grows over it, probably planted in the 1880's. Every year, the Allans, the Gateway staff, and patrons eagerly look forward to its blooming. "We've had to cut it back several times because it gets so heavy," said Ruth, "but it always comes back". As will the windmill &
