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
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Hello, and welcome to the 64th season of live, professional theatre at The Gateway!





MEL BROOKS (Writer, Composer & Lyricist, Producer.) Director, producer, writer and actor, Mel Brooks is the recipient of three 2001 Tony Awards (Best Score, Best Book of a Musical, Best Musical) and two Grammy Awards (Best Musical Show Album and Best Long Form Music Video) for The Producers. Mr. Brooks began his distinguished career during television's "Golden Age" as a writer for Sid Caesar on Your Show of Shows in 1951. In 1955 and in 1957, Brooks received Emmy Award nominations (with others) for the best comedy writing for Caesar's Hour, and in 1956 he was nominated (with others) for best writing for a variety or situation comedy. In 1952, Brooks wrote sketches for Leonard Sillman's Broadway smash-hit revue, New Faces of 1952, and in 1957, together with Joe Darion, he wrote the book for the Broadway musical Shinbone Alley, which starred Eartha Kitt. In 1962, he wrote the

book for the Broadway musical All-American, starring Ray Bolger. In the'60s, Brooks teamed up with Carl Reiner to write and perform The 2000 Year Old Man albums, which became immediate bestsellers. In 1960 and 1961, Brooks and Reiner received Grammy Award nominations for the best spoken word comedy for 2000 Years and for best comedy performance for 2000 And One Years, respectively. In 1997, Brooks and Reiner teamed up again for The 2000 Year Old Man In The Year 2000. Both a book and a CD were released, the CD winning a Grammy Award in 1998 for the best spoken word album: comedy. Brooks wrote and narrated The Critic, a short satire on avant-garde art films, which received the Academy Award for best animated short subject in 1964. In 1965, he teamed up with Buck Henry and created Get Smart, the long-running televisions show starring Don Adams as Agent 86. Brooks, along with others, received an Emmy Award for outstanding writing achievement in a comedy-variety in 1967 for the Sid Caesar, Imogene Coca, Carl Reiner, Howard Morris Special. In 1968, he wrote and directed his first feature film, The Producers, starring Zero Mostel and Gene Wilder, which earned him an Academy Award for the best original screenplay written directly for the screen. He then went on to create a remarkable string of hit comedies: 1970, he wrote, directed and acted in The Twelve Chairs: 1974, co-wrote, directed and acted in Blazing Saddles, and was nominated,

In addition, he is a long-time contributor of humor to The New Yorker, an Emmy-Award winning writer of television comedy, and a collaborator on a number of screenplays, including Mel Brooks' Spaceballs and To Be Or Not To Be. He and his wife, Carolyn, divide their time between a home in Nantucket and an apartment in Greenwich Village, near which, on Hudson Street, she owns and presides over the long-running and near-legendary



dedicated to theatre training. He is also the creator of Stage Write, the revolutionary app for directors and choreographers which has been dubbed by SDC as the 'new standard method for documentation of staging and choreography'.

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
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Q&A YOUNG FRANKENSTEIN DIRECTOR

JEFF WHITING

Jeff Whiting was the Assistant Choreographer for the Original Broadway production of *Young Frankenstein*, and directed the national tour. Called a 'theatrical miracle worker' by Mario Fratti (NINE) and 'a truly remarkable talent' on THE VIEW, Jeff has had an amazing association with Tony Awardwinners and nominees, including *Hair* & *The Scottsboro Boys*. Later this fall, he continues his work with Susan Stroman on the Broadway debut of *Big Fish* at the Neil Simon Theatre.

You were there in the early days of *Young Frankenstein*. How do you create a new musical, especially from a movie that is so well known?

It's a challenge. The film is so iconic and people come to it with expectations. There's famous lines that people know and love, yet you couldn't just regurgitate the film. So, we had to deliver the old punchlines, while building new punchlines. In the musical, the punchlines become songs ("Roll in the Hay," "He Vas My Boyfriend"). You always have to find new surprises in the process.

In Gateway's production, most of the principles, are new to the show. They all know the film, but each actor has their own take on it. When I was acting at MGM Studios, a director once gave me a line reading. Every time I said the line, I felt as if I was doing a bad impression of the director. Because of that, you'll never see me giving line readings. I trust that they'll find it. Even when we did the national tour, we approached it as something new.



Additionally, we tried to create and maintain the feel of Mel's film. He wanted to give a nod to the great black and white horror flicks, like the 1931 James Wale film... the cobwebs, the angry villagers.

How involved was Mel Brooks in the creative process?

Mel was at rehearsals every day and has been completely invested in the project since the show's conception. He was also extremely collaborative and respectful of Susan Stroman's vision.

Mel has unbelievable comic timing. We would try something and he would say, "no, it's funnier if you do it like this" and we would put it in that night's preview. Sure enough, it would get a bigger laugh. This show is a classic Mel Brooks mix of high-brow and low-brow. I spoke to him recently and he wished he could be here. He's thrilled that the show is playing at Gateway.

Throughout your career, you have had a very strong relationship with great directors, like Susan Stroman and Diane Paulus, who recently received a Tony for her revival of *Pippin*. What has this been like?

I learned how to work with actors, how to find intentions and beats, amongst other things. They taught me to treat others with respect and love, without being threatening. They also showed me how to organize pieces of

big shows, like Young Frankenstein.



You also run The Open Jar Institute, a training program that pairs young actors with Broadway stars. Summer sessions will be starting soon at the Gateway Acting School. Can you share some wisdom for those studying their craft?

My advice: You are enough.

I see actors who try to guess what the director wants and become something they're not. We each have our own circumstances, our own lives, a soul and spirit that makes us unique. I think young actors sometimes see careers or professionals that they want to emulate, but it's better to be unique and be like yourself. That way you can enter the room as a whole person. Everyone has a perfect role to play.

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
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


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
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
